**Day 1: Monday, March 16, 2026 Overnight Flight** Your adventure begins with an overnight flight to Italy. Journey through southern Italy and experience its rich scenery, art, culture, food and wine.

**Day 2: Tuesday, March 17, 2026 Rome, Italy** Your tour opens in the “Eternal City” of Rome! Tonight, join your fellow travelers for a welcome dinner celebrating the start of your Italian journey. (D)

**Day 3: Wednesday, March 18, 2026 Rome** Start your day with a locally guided walking tour of Rome’s Renaissance and Baroque highlights. Climb to the top of the Spanish Steps for views of the city’s skyline and down its famous 135 stairs. Stroll over cobblestone streets and weathered passageways to discover famous sights such as the Trevi Fountain and the Pantheon’s imposing facade. Finish a full morning of exploration in the oval-shaped Piazza Navona, built upon the site of the ancient Stadium of Domitian. The afternoon is yours. Perhaps you’ll meander through Rome’s lively *Monti* district to soak in the local life. (B)

**Day 4: Thursday, March 19, 2026 Rome** Today, join an expert guide to explore the Imperial Fora. Take in views of the Colosseum’s exterior, the remains of the Basilica of Maxentius, and of Trajan’s Markets. Your extensive walking tour winds its way through Rome’s medieval district, which developed organically from the ruins of the ancient city. This neighborhood is a charming combination of narrow cobbled streets, dark tufa stone, and repurposed Roman ruins. Make the most of a free afternoon in Italy’s capital city. Perhaps you will join an optional food tour dinner and taste your way around Rome’s bohemian *Trastevere* district. (B)

**Day 5: Friday, March 20, 2026 Rome - Pompeii - Amalfi Coast** Journey to the Amalfi Coast, an iconic coastline of rocky beaches and towering cliffs. En route, pause at a local winery to savor the area’s famous *Lacryma Christi* wine. Enjoy a typical lunch before experiencing the eerily preserved ruins of Pompeii your way, because **it’s your choice!** Join a local guide for an in-depth tour of Pompeii’s best-known monuments -OR- venture further afield to discover the hidden corners of this vast archeological site. In the late afternoon, settle into the Amalfi Coast,\* your home for the next five nights. Before gathering for dinner, take some time to explore your hotel, perched in a scenic location above the coastline. (B, L, D)

**Day 6: Saturday, March 21, 2026 Amalfi Coast Drive\*\*** along the stunning Amalfi Coast, pausing at a panoramic viewing point for a peek at Positano, with its pastel-colored houses clinging to the cliff. Spend time in the town of Amalfi. A former trading hub, Amalfi is now a quiet coastal town of historic landmarks and a black-and-white marble cathedral. Explore on your own before boarding a ferryboat and sailing to Salerno. Return to your hotel for an evening at leisure. (B)

**Day 7: Sunday, March 22, 2026 Amalfi Coast** Journey along the eastern cliffs of the Bay of Naples to the charming resort town of Sorrento. Wander through its narrow streets, perhaps peeking into the peaceful cloister of St. Francis or sampling some gelato made with local lemons. This afternoon, visit a traditional terraced farm and see how cheese is still made by hand. Get a taste of the product at a farm-to-table dinner capped with homemade limoncello before returning to your hotel in the late evening. (B, D)

**Day 8: Monday, March 23, 2026 Amalfi Coast** Enjoy a day at leisure to take in the relaxing beauty of the Amalfi Coast. Perhaps you will embark on an optional ferryboat trip\*\*\* to the Mediterranean isle of Capri, where you’ll enjoy lunch and a locally guided tour before setting out on your own adventure. A two-hour ferryboat ride takes you back to the hotel in the early evening. (B)

**The overall activity level of this tour is a level 3.** This means you're an on-the-go traveler. You don't want to miss a thing, so walking and standing for longer periods of time (2-3 hours) isn't a big deal. A moderately paced two-and-a-half-hour walking tour, covering several miles, hills, and uneven surfaces, is no problem for you. Walking four miles over the course of a day is very doable, as is climbing into and out of various modes of transportation (tuk-tuk, cable car, zodiac, etc.). You can climb three flights of stairs easily, stand for extended periods of time, up to 30 minutes at a time, and handle altitudes between 6,000 and 9,000 feet. Expect some longer days with early mornings or late nights balanced with free time to recharge or set out on your own adventure. Our Client Care Agents can provide additional information or assistance to help you determine the perfect trip for you.

**Travel with an average of 37 people (maximum of 44).**

The archeological site of Pompeii is entirely pedestrianized, and the only access is via a steep ancient Roman street which is uphill and paved with huge, slippery cobblestones. Therefore, the site is not "accessible" by disabled standards. Throughout the archeological site, you will need to negotiate large cobblestones and steep sidewalks. There are NO vehicles inside the site, which is extremely vast. We recommend bringing comfortable, well broken-in walking shoes. You should expect large crowds at each location, with long waiting times at ferry embarkation points where there is no seating available and you will be required to queue without seating, under the sun without access to shaded areas.

The included sightseeing program in Rome, Pompeii, Sorrento, and Amalfi requires accessing locations that forbid motor coaches from circulating. The same applies for the optional tour sightseeing outlined in the itinerary. All these areas require extensive walking over cobblestones, uneven and often narrow sidewalks, and occasionally unpaved terrain with loose gravel.

If you require any special assistance while on tour, please make us aware at time of reservation so the necessary request form can be sent to your attention.

The included activities are not suitable for travelers using motorized scooters, wheelchairs, walkers or Zimmer-frames.

Days of features are interchangeable.

Most shops and businesses in Italy are closed on Sundays and on national/religious holidays.

\*\*\*The optional boat trip to the isle of Capri is dependent on sea and wind conditions. According to the weather conditions, the ferry boat ride may depart from Salerno, Sorrento or Naples. The length of the sailing depends on the port of departure, varying between 30 and 120 minutes each way. Travelers prone to seasickness should take the proper precautions.

\*\*Between November 1 and March 31, the visit of the first section of the Amalfi Drive will be operated by bus, and you will not visit Positano, which is not accessible by motorcoach. Depending on the weather, wind, and sea conditions, you will sail aboard a public ferryboat from Amalfi to Salerno. The sailing time is approximately 30 minutes. The Amalfi Coast drive is along a very narrow, winding road. Travelers prone to motion sickness and/or seasickness should take the proper precautions.

\*During your stay on the Amalfi Coast standard accommodations at the Hotel Raito are limited and available on a first come, first served basis for departures utilizing that hotel. Upgrades to superior rooms with a lateral view of the coastline and garden are available at an additional cost. Some departures will be accommodated in Sorrento where the hotel does not offer coastal views. Please inquire at time of booking.

Single accommodations are limited and are available on a first-come, first-served basis. Single rate subject to change based on availability.

To complete your tour, we include roundtrip airport-to-hotel transfers when purchasing our airfare with your tour. If you have arranged for your own air, we are pleased to provide you the option of purchasing these transfers. Please note that all transfers will leave at pre-scheduled times.



For air-inclusive reservations, the name provided at time of booking must match your government-issued ID that will be used during travel. Name changes are subject to penalties.

Our air passengers will depart from Naples airport.

Please be advised many airlines do not provide advance seat assignments until check-in at the airport. Advance seating will be subject to the airline's terms and conditions.

**IDENTIFICATION**

Passports are required for this tour at your expense. Certain countries require that your passport be valid at least 6 months beyond the dates of your travel. You are strongly urged to contact the appropriate consulate for details. **IMPORTANT:** We recommend that travelers take a photocopy of their passport and applicable visas. It should be packed separately from your actual passport and visa. We also recommend leaving a copy at home with your emergency contact.

*Effective for travel in May 2025, all visitors who do not need a visa to enter Europe will be expected to apply for an ETIAS visa waiver, for a fee, when visiting a Schengen Area Country.
